## Classroom News

## Prep/l/2/3

Welcome back everyone and a warm welcome to our Acting Principal Miss Nugent. We have hit the ground running this term and have commenced learning about Narratives and how authors develop characters for English. In Maths we are learning about number patterns (counting in $2 \mathrm{~s}, 5 \mathrm{~s}, 10 \mathrm{~s}$, for example), probability (what might/might not, will/will not happen, for example) and time. Prep are learning about different parts of the day, days of the week, duration: what takes a short/long time to complete; Year 1 - duration: hours, minutes, time to the hour and half hour; Year 2 - calendars, seasons, months, time to the quarter hour and Year 3 - telling time to the nearest minute and reading schedules. Tennis lessons commenced on Wednesday morning and were enjoyed by all. These will take place weekly over this term. Please ensure your child/ren have their hat and water bottle as we are not sharing hats and the drink taps are a long way from the tennis courts. Students can use sunscreen we have available, or they can use/apply their own.
I was very proud of the P-3 class for their conduct during the Anzac Parade last Friday. Thank you to Paisley and Noah who laid a wreath on behalf of our class. They handled this responsibility commendably.
Homework was sent home at the end of last week. We completed homework in class for Week 1 as we only had 3 days before it was due back at school. This gave students a chance to familiarise themselves with Spelling activities and our new addition - Maths. We will be marking Maths homework in groups each Friday so that we can follow student progress and address any difficulties being experienced. Cheers, Robyn Hurst

## Year 4-G

Welcome back to Term 2!
We are so excited for all of our new learning this term and even more excited for camp in Week 5!
So far this term we have begun our investigation in to Bushrangers throughout English and the impacts that these had on life in this time. Our goal for the end of the term is to be able to write a historical recount based on someone who lived during these times and
present this to a small group.
Our Year 5 \& 6 students have begun their investigation in to Colonial Settlements and the Gold Rush in HASS. This has extended on our learning in English and made some connections for our students in these areas. It has also allowed our students to get very excited for the activities that we will be participating in when we go to camp in Charters Towers. Our Year 3 \& 4 students have looked in to celebrations and commemorations. They began their research in to ANZAC Day and why this is a commemoration rather than a celebration. This has shown the importance of being solemn during these activities and celebrating those that require celebrating. Soon, students will be interviewing someone older than them about a celebration or commemoration of their choosing. They will be bringing questions home to ask someone at home so be on the lookout for these. This will form the basis of their assessment so please help them to answer these questions if they require it.
This term in Maths we are investigating time, chance and probability and number and algebra. These are areas that we continually investigate each year and developing their knowledge on them as they come around again. The students enjoy revising things that they learnt last year and going deeper each time that they come around again. Something new that the Year 4 students will explore is independent and dependent events, Year 5 students will explore is 24 hour time and the Year 6's will investigate square and triangular numbers. These are just a small snippet of new things that they will investigate however there is much more also.
All of our students have thoroughly enjoyed their Science lessons with Miss Nugent and getting to know her a little better. They are all very excited for their learning in this area and enjoying getting out and about during their learning time.
From Week 4, our PE unit will allow students to develop and practice their athletic abilities before our Athletics Day in Week 10. We will focus on a different activity each week to practice and then participate in some rotations to further our skills. In Health, the Year 3 \& 4 students will develop their heritage and culture and how this shapes them as a person. The Year 5 \& 6 students will examine how living a healthy and physical lifestyle will benefit them and their community.
